An Important Reminder from MARCH® Vision Care ICD-10 Transition Deadline is October 1, 2015

On October 1, 2015 the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services ("CMS") will require all providers to replace the currently used ICD-9 code sets for reporting medical diagnoses and inpatient procedures with the updated ICD-10 code sets.

Are You Prepared for the ICD-10 Transition?

As an eye care professional, it is important that you have a readiness plan in place to transition to the ICD-10 code set by the October 1, 2015 deadline. Your readiness plan should include:

Claims submitted after October 1, 2015 may not contain a combination of ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes. Claims may only contain one code set. This means providers are required to split the claim so all ICD-9 codes remain on one claim with dates of service through 9/30/2015 and all ICD-10 codes are placed on a separate claim with dates of service beginning 10/1/2015 and later.
